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#### Tree Care Advocate Program Overview

Minnesota Tree Care Advocate is an organization of University of Minnesota trained volunteers throughout the state that are dedicated to community forestry. It is currently comprised of three community forestry programs including Tree Care Advisor, Citizen Pruner, and Tree Steward. Minnesota Tree Care Advocate works to educate members of the state about their urban forest so that they, in turn, can volunteer in their neighborhoods and community.

From 1993 to 2016, 520 volunteers have attended a Tree Care Advocate training in Minnesota.


#### Minnesota Tree Care Advisors

The Minnesota Tree Care Advisor Program, founded in 1993, aids in the development of environmental stewards through education & promoting volunteerism. Tree Care Advisor volunteers provide communities throughout the state with a valuable pool of educated stewards to support & enhance our urban and community forests. Tree Care Advisors are welcome to pursue any volunteer activities related to tree care that suit their preferences. This extends from organizing volunteer tree inventory training & events in their community to attending tree planting events throughout the state.

In 2016, Tree Care Advisors completed an average of 14.55 hours on education.





#### Tree Care Advisor Activities by Category

Minnesota Tree Care Advisor Program volunteers completed their hours in many ways. Below you can find a breakdown based on three general categories: outreach (includes setup, tabling, and take down of booths, leading/teaching a class for adults or youth, answering questions from the public and citizens, responding to inquires for the Forest Outreach Line, etc.), community activities (includes assisting with tree plantings, tree maintenance, pruning events, watering trees, etc.), and community engagement (includes sitting on tree/environmental boards, assisting to write ordinances, planning events within a community, etc.)

In 2016, Tree Care Advisors completed an average of 59.34 volunteer hours.


#### Minnesota Citizen Pruners

The Minnesota Citizen Pruner Program aids in increasing local capacity by working with municipalities and engaging citizen in community forestry upkeep. Citizen Pruners are trained in tree biology, tree species identification and pruning restrictions, pruning techniques, and types of removals the community asks volunteer to preform. Citizen Pruners are able to manage small branches near the ground while tree care professionals can focus on larger branches higher in the tree canopy. Completing this ground work is vital for clearing sightlines, blocked sidewalks, and improving the health of both young and mature trees.

In 2016, Citizen Pruners completed a total of 487.8 volunteer hours.


#### Community Forest Outreach Line

The Community Forestry Outreach Line has been staff by Tree Care Advisors since 2013. Minnesotans can contact the information help desk throughout the year via two ways: by phone or by e-mail, whichever way is most convenient for the resident. Once the phone or email messages are received, Tree Care Advisor volunteers research the resident's tree-related questions and provide them with a non-biased resolution to their questions. In 2016, the Outreach Line was staffed by Annette LeDuc and Mary Magers. Since 2013, volunteers have answered 887 questions from the public.

In 2016, volunteers answered 208 questions from the public in total.


Throughout 2016, many questions reached our volunteers. Below, you can find the breakdown of question topics.
